BEST PRACTICE

HEALTH AND SAFETY INITIATIVE OF THE YEAR

We want to know about health and safety initiatives that really worked and helped change attitudes to safety in your workplace.

Examples

- New health and safety system management programmes
- Health and safety observation tools
- Staff education and/or training programmes

LOW CARBON FUTURE AWARD ^{NEW}

We want to hear about initiatives large and small that contribute to reducing or avoiding emissions of carbon dioxide and/or other greenhouse gases.

Examples

- An ongoing core business model or a strategic initiative based on net zero emissions
- A business-as-usual project which features emissions reduction as an outcome

Tell us about the way you have engaged and worked with your community to make a meaningful contribution.

Examples

- Negotiation of land access agreements, iwi engagement and equity partnership opportunities
- Community support, education, training and sponsorship programmes

If you are an under 40 up and coming star with the potential to go above and beyond in the future – tell us.

Examples

- Not limited to traditional 'executive roles' – can include general managers, project managers, production engineers, asset managers



WOMEN IN ENERGY AWARD

We are looking for women working in the energy sector who deserve to be recognised for their exceptional achievement and proven track record of success.

Examples

- Women who are respected throughout the energy sector for their contribution – this can include a range of roles
- Women who have delivered key projects and secured high priority outcomes in their current and past roles



EDITOR'S AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO THE SECTOR

This award goes to an exceptional individual who has made a significant and long-term contribution to the New Zealand energy sector over a period of time.

We do not accept nominations for this category, nor do we announce finalists, rather the winner is chosen by the editor of *Energy News*.
